sent from you (Cousin Skeffington) whereby they are commanded within
ten days after the receipt thereof to appear in his Majesty's Court of
Admiralty ~~within ten days after the receipt thereof~~ And withal
~~to~~ required in their behalf that they may be enlarged from their
imprisonment to ~~that they may~~ make their appearance accordingly as either
upon bail (if you may accept thereof or as in your discretion shall be thought fittest or else that
you or one of you will signify the contrary ~~by~~ unto me or them by writing
which request being (in my opinion very reasonable I cannot but commend
unto you ~~and~~ with my heartiest Commendations and so rest
