Right worshipfull and my very much respected freind: I have caused your sonne to write out the note of this guarters expences which arise to the greater summe, because he was entred in the daunceinge schoole. as he enformes me by your appoyntment, but had I not had good experience of his ingenuous nature, I would not have given way vnto it, vppon soe weak warrant as his word, vnles I had understood your worships mind by a letter: not that I mislik the thinge, which is an exercise well beseeminge a gentleman and noe hindrance to his study, but I thinke it vnfit for a Tutor to lay out any thinge extraordinary, for his pupill without he be fully secured that it standes with his likeinge to whom he is to give vp the accounts of all expences, younge mens wills and wordes are not alwayes Tutors warrants, neither would I haue easely giuen way vnto this but that I knew who I trusted, for to speak noe more of him than I doe with ioy dayly behold hn him. he is one that deserves my commendatory letters both for his studious and virtuous behauiour, and be you assured that I will doe my best endeauour to hasten him forward in those well begunne courses: Thus not forgettinge my best respect and thankfulnes to your much respected wife, and my loue to your sonnes in hast I tak my leaue
