otherwayes yf to the last of this moneth I can <sup>more</sup> conveniently  
then provide it. many payement{es} at this midsomer  
daye vnfurnishe mee for present payement yet yf you<sup>r</sup>  
expectacōn bee to haue it at the daye I will doe my best  
to pvide yt And soe expectinge your answere w<sup>th</sup> remebance  
of loue and service will euer rest.
