to bee troble some vnto you yet I hope hope you and my La will bee pleased to ioyne who have in mutuall Consent to gratefie mee and them in our request that you will bee pleased who is that they may accompany and attend my so our soone into this Contrie to finishe to take some pleasure here in the end of Reuel{es} your kynd pmise in so doinge with that worthie respect you have ever had of your word mak{es} mee without doubt to obtayne my request wherevnto I doe allso here it may bee with the free consent of and will of my good La who I will ever indeavor my selfe to deserve who my best pswations to reteane him how and dutie toward{es} her. I have heard that since his beeinge here hee hath had the small pock{es} who I doubt not but before this time hee here here here here here had not be well recovered. I have sent my soone Richard Bagot who is my Sonne your honest neighbor Mr Sheldon who I praye. prayinge god to blesse him and Continew him in and with all yours in in health and send them and vs his gratiose protecton. And soe requiringe my love service may bee remembered ever assured vnto you and your worthie La who lyke from my wiefe will ever rest
