ffather) I have receased your kind, and fatherly letter: kinde in that there=by you advertise me of thinkges necessarie for maintenance which I was to recease, and according to your letter have receased; fatherly in that you by a fatherly admonition command a reformation of a thinge amisse, to witt, the forme of my writing, which if I had knowen before I coulde easilye have altered, and hence forth will daylie showe that I can easily change it, nether will I thereby any more showe a barren invention. Thus feareing lest with my prolixitie I may molest, your more serious cogitations, or incurre your displeasure, giveing you hartie thankes for that I have at this time receased, & with the rememberance of my humble dutie vnto you, I humblie take my leave, and rest.
