my L of Pembroke is not half well. m<sup>r</sup> Morley  
hearing by me of the maner of your disease doth  
assure that it is the Cholick and wisheth to  
kepe your feete warme / and that you should not  
be diseased in the night to be awaked out of yo<sup>r</sup>  
slepe. if I can get Some of Doctor Sauls  
Water I will bring you Some w<sup>ch</sup> did him (as  
he saith) great good. thursday next my L  
of Essex hath appointed to heare our matters  
& all that be done We knowe not when to  
go hence. good Brother remember my humble  
Duty to my mother and Com<sup>s</sup> to your Self, my  
sister, sister okeouer & Sister Letice  
I wish you health, from London in hast  
this xxx<sup>th</sup> of May
