Mr Morley hearing by me of the manner of your disease doth assure that it is the Cholic and wisheth to keep your feet warm / and that you should not be diseased in the night to be awaked out of your sleep. if I can get Some of Doctor Saul's Water I will bring you Some which did him (as he saith) great good. Thursday next my Lord of Essex hath appointed to hear our matters & all that be done We know not when to go hence, good Brother remember my humble Duty to my mother and Commendations to your Self, my sister, Sister Okeover & Sister Lettice I wish you health, from London in haste this 30th of May
