Good Brother, Mr Doctor Moffett is not come up to London  
my Lord of Pembroke is not half well. Mr Morley  
hearing by me of the manner of your disease doth  
assure that it is the Cholic and wisheth to  
keep your feet warm / and that you should not  
be diseased in the night to be awaked out of your  
sleep. if I can get Some of Doctor Saul's  
Water I will bring you Some which did him (as  
he saith) great good. Thursday next my Lord  
of Essex hath appointed to hear our matters  
& all that be done We know not when to  
go hence. good Brother remember my humble  
Duty to my mother and Commendations to your Self, my  
sister, Sister Okeover & Sister Lettice  
I wish you health, from London in haste  
this 30<sup>th</sup> of May
