Good Brother, mr Doctor Muffet is not come vp to London
my *Lord* of Pembroke is not half well. mr Morley
hearing by me of the maner of your disease doth
assure that it is the Cholick and wisheth to
kepe your feete warme / and that you should not
be diseased in the night to be awaked out of your
slepe. if I can get Some of Doctor Sauls
Water I will bring you Some *which* did him (as
he saith) great good. thursday next my *Lord*
of Essex hath appointed to heare our matters
& all that be done We knowe not when to
go hence. good Brother remember my humble
Duty to my mother and *Commendations* to your Self, my
sister, sister okeouer & Sister Letice
I wish you health, from London in hast
this xxxth of May
