I need not write to you toof this great journey, for I am sure it is known everywhere but that myself is determined to go, it may be you are ignorant, & therefore in shaking hands for a farewell I am forced by writing only to let you understand thereof being sorry that before my going I may not see you. I pray you send up such assurance as is requisite for my money to Charles Bussey, I dare trust you for a greater matter vet because my journey is casual & that I desire to leave my estate certain I therefore desire it. Commend me in all kindness to my sister & yourself. Thus wishing to you as to myself I leave you to the protection of the Almighty I farewell London the 7<sup>th</sup> of June
