I pray you send vp such assurance as is requesite for my money to Charles Bussy, I dare trust you for a greater matter vet because my iourney is casuall & that I desvre to leaue my estate certayne I therefore desyre it. Commend me in all kindnes to my sister & your selfe. Thus wishing to you as to my selfe I leave you to the protection of the allmighty I farrewell London the viith of Iune
