As duty Constraineth me I am to let you understand as near as I Can when my Lord meaneth to take his journey towards Cambridge: the which at this present he is determined to take the fourth of this month. The Cause of his tarrying so long at the Court was to see the coming of one Casamir a French Ambassador, whom (the Queen's grace) doth greatly esteem,/ for this first of February there was such a show of noble men & gentlemen in the Tiltyard at Whitehall, as the Like (by every man's report) hath not been seen this forty years. further to trouble vou herein I think it is needless for the bearer hereof Mr Hocleton can Certify you./ And thus in haste I Commit you to God who ever defend you & all yours./ from London the second of February 1578.
