Good cosen, my vnclē Edwardē Bassett, and my selfe, beinge Att
Blythfeilde wth you, did move yo^u, in the behalfe of this Lame sovdier,
William Lee; who hath lived in verrie poore estate, this six yeares,
in Englande, wthout Anye Releeffe of the cuntrye, soe I desyer yo^u, thatt
yo^u would please, to helpe him to such yearely stypentt, As other
meamed souldiers haue, wthin the shyer, thatt Are in like case, soe
not dowtinge, of yo^r best furtherance herein, wth my kinde comēd{es}
to yo^u and my cosen Rest./
