Good father vnderstandinge by M^r Hollinns one of the fellowes of ou^r house whoe came lately forth of Staffordshyre that it hath pleased god to take away my good Grandmothe^r from vs, I can not but take it very heavily because she hath bin eu{er} lovinge and most kinde both to me and all the rest of vs, yet I praise god for spareinge ^{^her} soe longe ^{^a} time amongst vs whome I doubt not but he hath made partaker of his æternall fælicitie. Now therefore haveinge soe convenient a messinge^r as this bearer. M^r Mortons sonne of Angleton whoe was a student in our house but now is gone away, I could not but remember my humble dutie to you and my mother, and that thankes be to god I am in perfect health. Thus cravinge your dayly blessing{es} and prayinge to the allmightie for y^r longe prosperitie I rest in hast./

Oxon: the 9th of Aprill 1608 Yo^r dilligent and most obeadient sonne Har: Bagott

Postscript:

I haue sent you here inclosed a note how all our mony is layed forth and I pray you send vs vp some more as soone as you can for I haue neede of soute a new sute of Apparill./
