M^r Browne, I haue receyved the Quenes Mai^{ties} Co^mmission vnder the greate Seale of England, touchinge fugetives, in the countye of Surr/ In w^{ch} Commission, M^r Weson, M^r Baron Birche M^r More, M^r Agmondesh^am and yo^u are ioyned wth me. I purpose (god willinge) to be at my howse at Reigate vpon ffridaie nexte; where I would most willinglye haue yo^u all, to consider if the content{es} of the same Co^mmission, and therevpon to p^{ro}ceede accordinglye. I praie yo^u therefore finde some meanes to sende woorde hereof vnto M^r Weston, M^r More, M^r Agmondesh^am, and M^r Birche (if he be nere at hande) and y^t they be wth me at my howse vpon mondaie nexte, and then we will ~~consider~~ ^{conferr} together what is beste to Done / And so wth commenda^{co}ns I bid you farewell. / ffrom the Courte this Mondaie morny^{ng}e the viith of Aprill / 1572 /
