M<sup>r</sup> Browne, I haue receyved the Quenes Mai<sup>ties</sup> Co<sup>m</sup>mission vnder the greate Seale of England, touchinge fugetives, in the countye of Surr/ In w<sup>ch</sup> Commission, M<sup>r</sup> Weson, M<sup>r</sup> Baron Birche M<sup>r</sup> More, M<sup>r</sup> Agmondesh<sup>a</sup>m and yo<sup>u</sup> are ioyned w<sup>th</sup> me. I purpose (god willinge) to be at my howse at Reigate vpon ffridaie nexte; where I would most willinglye haue yo<sup>u</sup> all, to consider if the content{es} of the same Co<sup>m</sup>mission, and therevpon to p<sup>ro</sup>ceede accordinglye. I praie yo<sup>u</sup> therefore finde some meanes to sende woorde hereof vnto M<sup>r</sup> Weston, M<sup>r</sup> More, M<sup>r</sup> Agmondesh<sup>a</sup>m, and M<sup>r</sup> Birche (if he be nere at hande) and y<sup>t</sup> they be w<sup>th</sup> me at my howse vpon mondaie nexte, and then we will ~~consider~~ <sup>conferr</sup> together what is beste to Done / And so w<sup>th</sup> commenda<sup>co</sup>ns I bid you farewell. / ffrom the Courte this Mondaie mornyng the vii<sup>th</sup> of Aprill / 1572 /
