Mr Browne, I haue receyved the Quenes Mai^{ties} Comission vnder the greate Seale of England, touchinge fugetives, in the countye of Surr/ In w^{ch} Commission, Mr Weson, Mr Baron Birche Mr More, Mr Agmondesh^am and yo^u are ioyned wth me. I purpose (god willinge) to be at my howse at Reigate vpon ffridaie nexte; where I would most willinglye haue yo^u all, to consider if the content{es} of the same Comission, and their evpon to pceade accordinglye. I praie yo^u their efore finde some meanes to sende woorde hereof vnto Mr Weston, Mr More, Mr Agmondesh^am, and Mr Birche (if he be nere at hande) and yt they be wth me at my howse vpon mondaie nexte, and then we will consider conferr together what is beste to Done / And so wth commendacons I bid you farewell. / ffrom the Courte this Mondaie mornynge the viith of Aprill / 1572 /
