The busines of thys church, and all other busines w<sup>ch</sup> concerne me in thys town determine thys weeke: so that I might be at my liberty to go to do the duty to my church in the Cuntry, next weeke, but for the expectation of that 100<sup>l</sup>, w<sup>ch</sup> ^you are to pay some days after that. If therefore yt stand not w<sup>th</sup> yo<sup>r</sup> conveniency to pay yt before, because I presume yo<sup>w</sup> wyll be gone out of town, before that 11<sup>th</sup> of July, I ame bold to intreat yo<sup>w</sup> to let me know, by whose hands yt shall be payd me then. for besides that yt were a great disappointment of my necessary service in the Cuntry, to be stayd any longer in thys town, so not to receyve yt at y<sup>t</sup> day, wyll put me to so great a trouble, as to make my poore wyll anew, and to subtract from my other children, theyr part of thys 100<sup>l</sup>. Therefore I humbly intreat yo<sup>w</sup>, that I may hear from yo<sup>w</sup>, before y<sup>r</sup> goinge out of town, and rest
