yt may please yow to vnderstand herby that we Received  
the bodye of Iohn Smythe in to our howse of Correccion  
from the Ioale of Norwich. as by the warrent  
I doe herwith send vnto *your worship*, maye apere.  
Who we fynd to be a pore weake Sicke and ympotent  
Creator. no waye able to labor, therby to releve him  
Sellfe and much fyter yt is that he wer Comforted  
Then Chastised. I Thought good therfore to  
Commend his miserable and lamentable estat to  
*your* worships wisdome and Compassyon: that yf  
yow Shall So please he maye be dischargede  
And Set at lybbertie. Thus hvmbly Takinge my  
Leave and Rest. *your* worships to be Command
