After my duty presented to you and my honored Aunt, These few lines are to acquaint vour Hon." v<sup>t</sup> I have almost Copyed out another of y<sup>e</sup> Questions and Answers in which I hope you will find some better writing then in ye last which I gave to you Hon., and as soon as I have done this y<sup>t</sup> I am now about, I think to begin another of ye same if your Hon. think fitt of it, I should have bin very glad to have seen your Hon. and to my honored Aunt to day, but y<sup>t</sup> I doe take y<sup>e</sup> waters I took them yester= :day and I intend to take them to morrow god willing: pray give my service to m<sup>r</sup> & m. rs Cross, I doe follow my Copying in ye afternoons but cannot Cypher in ye mornings by reason of my taking of v<sup>e</sup> waters but assoon as I have done taking of them, I will goe every morning, having no more to add at this time but begging your hon. s pardon for troubling you at this time with my bad writing but hoping y<sup>t</sup> in a short time you will see a great change for v<sup>e</sup> better, so begging your prayers for me who daily stands in need of them so
